Progress Report/Tasks Completed:

1) In February 2008, NAKPEHE entered into an agreement with the Copyright Clearance Center (CCC), a non-profit U.S. company based in Danvers, MA that provides collective copyright licensing services for corporate and academic users of copyrighted materials. The agreement establishes a fee structure for use of published materials, (primarily *Quest* articles,) for which NAKPEHE owns the copyright. The fee structure is based on figures recommended by a CCC representative as being typical for small professional organizations such as NAKPEHE. We anticipated that this would provide a small, but steady revenue stream for the organization. (See Executive Secretary-Treasurer's report for figures.)

Fee Structure:

Academic permissions service (paper course packs) (p.3) 10 cents/page Electronic course content service (p.4) 10 cents/page Transactional Reporting Service (p.8) \$5 per article Digital Permissions Service (pp. 9-10) Digital transmission 1-49 recipients \$1.00 per recipient 50-249 " \$0.75 per recipient 250-499 " \$0.50 per recipient 500+ (not allowed) Republication, based on circulation fee multiplier table, with base fee set at \$100 for 0-499 copies. (Fee increases by a multiplier with greater circulation.)

Republication by an author - permission granted with no fee.

Permissions not granted: Intranet Posting (to an internal network) Extranet Posting (to network users external to the building housing the server) Internet Posting

Our plan was to reevaluate the fee structure at the end of the year based on revenue received and any feedback from users. Based on interactions with those seeking permissions, most seemed fine with the established fee structure. The one exception was the case of a Human Kinetics book by Shirl Hoffman, in which neither author nor publisher was willing to pay to republish *Quest* material in the book.

2) Under the leadership of *Chronicle* editor Mike Metzler, with the November 2008 (Volume 19, Number 3) issue, NAKPEHE launched

an all-electronic version of the *Chronicle of Kinesiology and Physical Education in Higher Education*.

Suggestions for Future Plans Related to this Office/Committee:

Recommend that NAKPEHE continue the current CCC agreement with the current fee structure, with the understanding that any objections to the permissions fee be reviewed for possible exceptions to the fee assessment on a case-by-case basis by the Executive Committee.
